#### verbo + adverbio

After a long delay, the plane finally **took off**.

#### verbo + preposición + objeto

Detectives are still **looking for** the escaped prisoner.  
They never **got over** the shock and dissolved the band.  
The auditors **went into** every aspect of the company's operations.  
The president **called on** the United Nations to intervene in the fighting.

#### verbo + adverbio + preposición + objeto

Thousands of children **run away from** home each year.  
In many cases, companies do not **cut down on** expenses directly.  
She was a patient woman and always **put up with** his violent temper.  
Sam never liked his job and always **looked forward to** the end of his shift.

#### verbo + (objeto) + adverbio + (objeto)

The firm is considering **turning off** the air-conditioning for the event.  
The firm is considering **turning** the air-conditioning **off** for the event.  
I have to **fill out** this application by the end of the week.  
I have to **fill** this application **out** by the end of the week.  
The two sides in the conflict are trying to **work out** a peace plan.  
The two sides in the conflict are trying to **work** a peace plan **out**.
