verbo + adverbio

verbo + preposición + objeto

They never **got over** the shock and dissolved the band.

verbo + adverbio + preposición + objeto

Thousands of children **run away from** <u>home</u> each year.

In many cases, companies do not **cut down on** expenses directly.

She was a patient woman and always **put up with** his violent temper.

Sam never liked his job and always **looked forward to** the end of his shift.

verbo + (objeto) + adverbio + (objeto)

The firm is considering **turning off** the air-conditioning for the event.

The firm is considering **turning** the air-conditioning **off** for the event.

I have to **fill out** this application by the end of the week.

I have to **fill** this application **out** by the end of the week.
