Tiempos del presente y del pasado

Presente simple

I work at a hospital.

Do you live in La Plata?
We don't live in Buenos Aires.

He plays tennis.

Does she speak Italian?
It doesn't rain in winter.

They **go** to school.

Do they play the guitar?

They don't come from Spain.

Presente continuo

I'm working (now).

Are you staying at a hotel? We aren't watching TV.

He's playing tennis (now).

Is she learning French?

It isn't raining.

They're going to school (now).

Are they having lunch (now)?

They aren't speaking.

Pasado simple

I **played** tennis yesterday.

Did you play tennis yesterday? We didn't play last week.

He **left** five minutes ago.

Did she leave early today?

He didn't leave at 8 o'clock.

They ate fish last night.

Did they eat beef for lunch?

They didn't eat soup for lunch.

Pasado continuo

I was working at that time.

Were you staying at a hotel?

We weren't watching TV.

He was playing tennis at 8.

Was she learning French then?

It wasn't raining at that time.

They were going to school.

Were they having lunch then?

They weren't speaking then.

Tiempos perfectos del presente y del pasado

Presente perfecto

I've talked with Susan.

Have you ever talked to her?

We haven't talked yet.

He's (already) read that book.

Has she read that book (yet)?

She hasn't read that book (yet).

They've already eaten.

Have they (ever) eaten caviar?

They haven't eaten (yet).

Pasado perfecto

I'd talked with Susan by then.

Had you talked to her by then?

We hadn't talked before that.

He'd (already) read it by that time.

Had she read it before that?

She hadn't read it before.

They'd already eaten by then.

Had they eaten caviar before?

They hadn't eaten by then.

Presente perfecto continuo

I've been talking with Susan.

Have you been talking to her?

We haven't been talking lately.

He's been reading a lot lately.

Has she been reading a lot?

She hasn't been reading much.

They've been eating a lot lately.

Have they been eating a lot?

They haven't been eating much.

Pasado perfecto continuo

I'd been talking with Susan.

Had you been talking to her?

We hadn't been talking.

He'd been reading a lot.

Had she been reading a lot?

She hadn't been reading much.

They'd been eating before that.

Had they been eating before?

They hadn't been eating.

Tiempos del presente y del futuro

Presente continuo

I'm studying tonight.

Are you coming tomorrow?

We aren't buying a TV.

He's playing tennis at 8.

Is she getting married?

It isn't starting until May.

They're moving to Italy.

Are they staying for lunch?

They aren't meeting her today.

Futuro simple

I'll study tonight.
Will you come tomorrow?
We won't buy a TV.

He'll play tennis with him.
Will she get married?
It won't rain today.

They'll move to Italy soon.

Will they stay for lunch?

They won't meet her this week.

Futuro con "going to"

I'm going to study (tonight).

Are you going to come?

We aren't going to buy a TV.

He's going to play tennis at 8.

Is she going to get married?

It isn't going to start until May.

They're going to move to Italy.

Are they going to stay for tea?

They aren't going to meet her.

Condicional simple

I'd study if I had the books.

Would you come tomorrow?

We wouldn't buy a TV if ...

He'd play tennis with him if ...

Would she get married if ...?

It wouldn't rain if ...

They'd move to Italy if ...

Would they stay for lunch?

They wouldn't meet her if ...

Voz pasiva

Estructura básica

The police **arrested the criminals** this morning.

SUJETO

VERBO

OBJETO

The criminals were arrested this morning (by the police).

SUJETO BE + PARTICIPIO PASADO

(AGENTE)

Verbos con dos objetos

Susan **sent John an invitation** last week.

John was sent an invitation last week (by Susan).

An invitation was sent to John last week (by Susan).

Verbos con una cláusula como objeto

People think that he killed his wife.

He is thought to have killed his wife.

It is thought that he killed his wife.

Voz activa

He tidies the room.

He is tidying the room.

He has tidied the room.

He tidied the room.

He was tidying the room.

He had tidied the room.

He is going to tidy the room.

He will tidy the room.

He would tidy the room.

He can tidy the room.

He might tidy the room.

Voz pasiva

The room is tidied.

The room is being tidied.

The room has been tidied.

The room was tidied.

The room was being tidied.

The room had been tidied.

The room is going to be tidied.

The room will be tidied.

The room would be tidied.

The room can be tidied.

The room might be tidied.

The building was painted last week.
